Main research themes and their characteristics

[Design of places for people and companies' activities]

In my hands-on experience, I have designed a wide variety of cases, including residences, facilities related to traditional industries, closed schools, public buildings, and medium- to large-scale wooden buildings, and have created architecture that is the foundation for residents, businesses, and users to live and work in a society and environment that maximizes their value, while unraveling the relationship between the individual or company and the society and environment surrounding them, and between the industrial structure and their products and services. Architectural design from this "branding" perspective improves the living environment for individuals and corporate value, while also contributing to the formation of landscapes and social development.

[Proposal and practice of social development using space as a resource]

After a period of rapid economic growth, Japan is now an aging society with a declining population. In this context, we are working with local residents' groups and businesses to reconstruct society and the environment using architecture that is in the process of being renewed, architecture that has finished its role due to changes in the social structure, and architecture that is a cultural heritage (heritage). The architecture that has been reassigned to this role adds new value to society and the environment, and brings vitality to the community.

[Proposals for Designs that Make the Most of Wood]

As the SDGs are influencing various social structures, wood with its carbon fixing function is attracting attention as a material for building materials and products, and various technologies are being developed. In addition, by properly managing wood, its resources can be utilized as a non-depleting resource and an important element of a regional recycling-oriented society. I am working on architectural and furniture designs that make the best use of wood.
